# Miranda Bennett

Miranda Bennett currently serves as the Acting Deputy Inspector General for Investigations at the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Inspector General. Ms. Bennett leads more than 500 federal law enforcement officers, investigators, and analysts responsible for conducting criminal and civil investigations of fraud, waste, and abuse affecting Health and Human Services programs. These efforts result in hundreds of criminal actions and indictments each year and produce significant financial recoveries that protect patients and safeguard federal health care funds.

Ms. Bennett began her career with HHS-OIG in 2005 as a Special Agent in the Dallas Regional Office. She later advanced into leadership roles, including serving as the Special Agent in Charge of the Dallas Region, where she oversaw enforcement operations across multiple Medicare Fraud Strike Force locations. Most recently, she served as an Assistant Inspector General for Investigations with oversight of three investigative regions and led national initiatives in cybersecurity, technology modernization, and the restructuring of administrative operations.

Ms. Bennett holds a Bachelor of Science in Political Science and Sociology from Texas A&M University. Ms. Bennett has been honored with the Inspector General's Bronze Medal and recognized by the Women in Federal Law Enforcement Foundation as an Outstanding Law Enforcement Employee.
